Clockwise from top: Giorgio Armani's Sensi White Notes (\$57.50) is an effervescent blend of lime, tangerine, black currant and luscious white flowers; Penhaligon's Lavandula (\$85) is a sensual mix of lavender, basil, pepper, lily, musk and vanilla; Frederic Malle Editions de Parfums presents Une Rose by Edouard Flécher (\$125), an extraordinary "dark" rose scent; Lulu Guinness' Life Is a Bed of Roses summer rose eau de parfum (\$80) is sold with a companion Rosewater luxurious face mist; Orange Blossom by Jo Malone (\$75) is a delightful blend of fresh florals, crisp citrus notes and dewy greens; L'Instant de Guerlain parfum (\$90) introduces a new fragrance category—crystalline amber—with notes of citrus honey, white flowers, amber and musk; designer Nanette Lepore's first fragrance (\$38) is a feminine bouquet of violets and roses laced with sparkling citrus notes; Kenneth Cole's Black eau de parfum for her (\$65) is a strikingly modern floral scent with exotic notes of black violet and lotus flower; Eau de Merveilles by Hermès (\$50) is a surprisingly feminine scent with masculine notes of woods and amber; L'OR de Torrente eau de toilette (\$60) adds the zing of green leaves and coffee to sweet notes of fruit and roses; Féraud parfum (\$72), inspired by the late designer's native Provence, is a warm elixir of fruit notes, delicate cherry blossoms, vanilla and sandalwood. ♥
